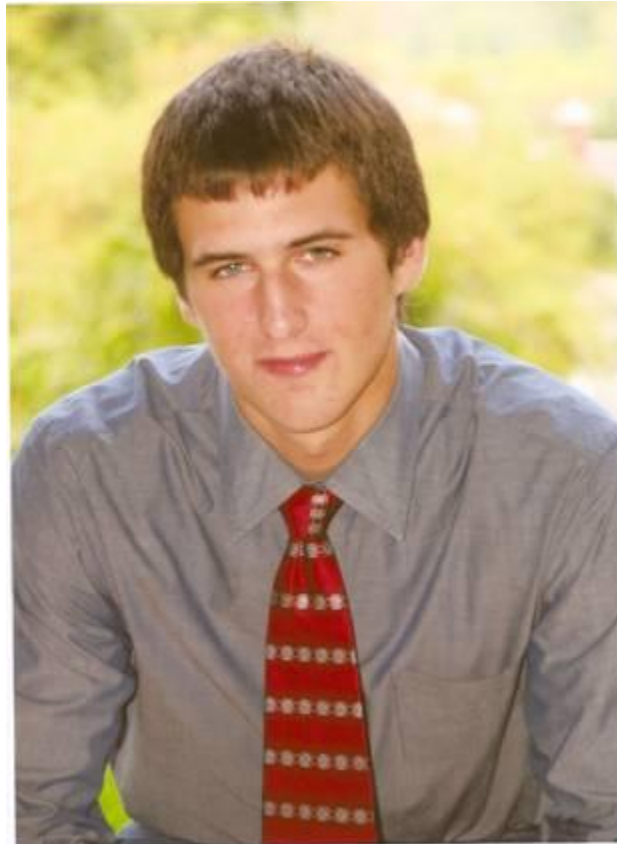


## **Saugerties Sports Hall of Fame Club 2010 Scholarship Award**



**Nathaniel “Nate” Meyers**

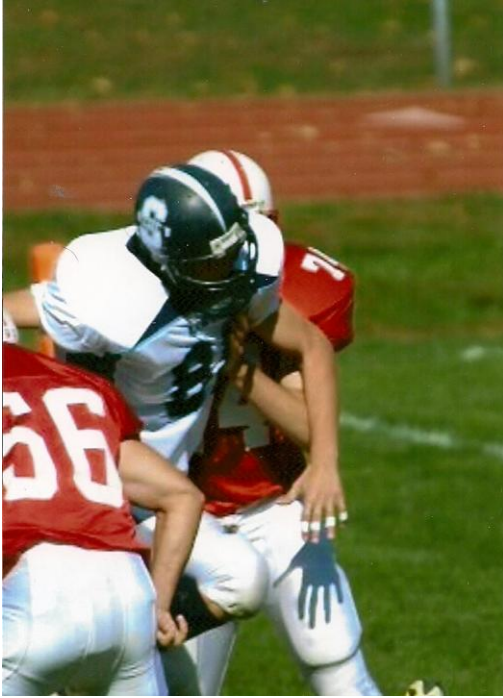

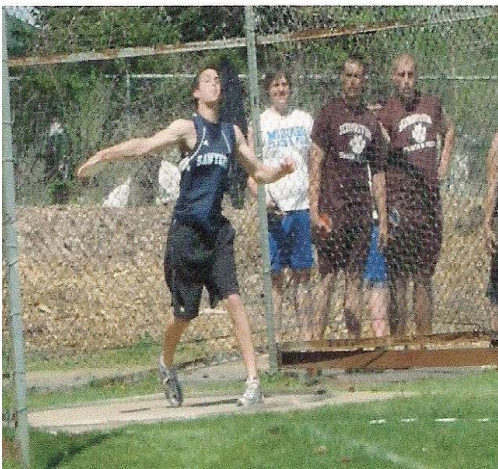
